## Where to Shop, Eat & Visit: Chapel Hill

**A SOUTHERN SEASON** | Known for its deliciously divine gift baskets, this acclaimed gourmet emporium boasts an amazing array of specialty foods, wines, coffees, teas, cookware, dinnerware, and home décor, as well as a cooking school and restaurant.

**RED WINDOW** | Brimming with a unique collection of home furnishings and accessories, this eclectic shop was the brainchild of the late Elizabeth Edwards and strives to offer the perfect find for every style and budget.

**ACKLAND ART MUSEUM** | Explore premier collections of Asian art, European masterworks, contemporary pieces, and regional pottery at this free-admission museum.

**SUGARLAND** | Those with a sweet tooth will be smitten with this dessert café that is prized for its creative cakes and cupcakes. Indulge in a heavenly assortment of made-from-scratch creations—eclairs, truffle bars, strawberry fool, and Northern Italian-style gelato.
